## June 12, 2017

The minutes were approved as presented.

Lewis Bulfer requested help with dust control on the gravel road past his place. There are 50 to over 250 vehicles past his place on a daily basis going to the tree dump. The township has had requests in the past for dust control. It is felt if the township helps with one area, they would have to help with all requests. It was suggested Lewis talk to the city (Nick Lardy) for help. They had indicated when the road was rebuilt a few years ago they would provide continuing help with maintenance materials.

Jesse Murphy applied for a new driveway at 748 170<sup>th</sup> Ave. He wishes to move the existing driveway to a location further south. He plans to install a culvert under the drive. Application approved.

The financials were reviewed.

David moved, seconded by Brian, to pay the bills.

Dan & Brian reviewed what is happening with the negotiations with Fairmont regarding fire services. There have been no meetings. A meeting is set for June 21 with Fairmont's committee.

ITC sent a letter advising about the construction timetable for their transmission line.

Membership cards from the MN Association of Townships were received.

MN Association of Townships Summer Short Courses are next week in Mankato.

Notice from the State Demographic Center place the April 1, 2016 population estimate at 250 and the households at 104.

The 2020 Census is requesting information on any additional addresses within the township.

The results of the public hearings regarding variance requests was received. The Krahmer request for a bin to close to the road in Section 17 was approved.

Township officials are the local weed inspectors and have the responsibility to notify landowners when noxious weeds are not being controlled.
